Chino Valley Fire District Offers Storm Safety Tips

There are several storm fronts expected to move through the Chino Valley over the next five days that may result in flooding and other hazardous road conditions.

The Chino Valley Fire District reminds residents not to drive around marked flood barricades or into floodwater. Most cars can be swept away in as little as 18-24 inches of moving water. If you encounter a flooded road, turn around and find an alternate route.

Home safety is also important to keep in mind during the upcoming storms. Properly filled and placed sandbags can act as a barrier to divert moving water around buildings during flooding caused by heavy rainfall.

The Fire District, in partnership with the cities we serve, offers 25 sandbags and sand at no cost to Chino Valley residents. Sandbags and sand are available at the following fire stations.
