

bordered by Los Angeles County to the northwest; Orange County to the southwest; Riverside County to the southeast; the City of Ontario to the northeast and the City of Montclair to the north. District personnel responded to 12,993 emergency incidents in 2019.





Revenues and other funding sources of \$49.1 million include \$2.0 million from committed Fund balance earmarked for equipment replacement. Fund balance is projected to be \$23.5 million at June 30, 2021, including \$6.2 million in the restricted Section 115 Trust, with those funds exclusively available to fund future pension obligations.

Fund Balance

JUNE 30, 2021 - \$23.5 MILLION



\$5 million was deposited from Fund balance into an IRS Section 115 Trust Fund for pension obligations during FY17. That account has since grown to over \$6 million and represents 26% of projected Fund balance at June 30, 2021. The largest segment of projected Fund balance at the end of FY21 is the committed portion at 54%, which includes funds earmarked by Board resolution for specific purposes,
